WHEREAS, the Hospital Authority of the City of DuBois (the "Authority") is an authority created under the provisions of the Municipality Authorities Act, (the Act of May 2, 1945, P.L. 382) (as amended and continued pursuant to the Act of June 19, 2001, P.L. 287, No.22 (53 Pa.C.S.Ch.56, as amended) (the "Act") by the City of DuBois (the "City"); and

WHEREAS, the Act specifies, <u>inter alia</u>, that the purpose of the Authority shall be for "... acquiring, holding, constructing, financing, improving, maintaining and operating, owning, leasing, either in the capacity of lessor or lessee, projects – including 'hospitals' and 'health centers';" and

WHEREAS, Penn Highlands Healthcare ("Penn Highlands") is a Pennsylvania nonprofit corporation formed as of October 1, 2011 in connection with the affiliation of DuBois Regional Medical Center ("DRMC") and its affiliates, including Brookville Hospital ("BH"), and Clearfield Hospital ("CH") and its affiliates, and the subsequent affiliation as of July 1, 2013, of Penn Highlands, DRMC and CH and their affiliates with Elk Regional Health Care Center, Inc. ("EH") and its affiliates, and the further subsequent affiliations as of December 30, 2019, of Jeffco Health Services, Inc. ("JHS") and J.C. Blair Memorial Hospital ("JCB") (collectively with any additional affiliations, including the anticipated affiliation with Monongahela Valley Hospital, Inc., a Pennsylvania nonprofit corporation ("MVH") on or about October 1, 2021, the "System"); and

WHEREAS, at the request of Penn Highlands, pursuant to the Act, the Authority intends to issue bonds in one or more series in any combination of variable and/or fixed rate, tax-exempt and/or taxable (the "Bonds") in a total aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$50,000,000, which will be used for any or all of the following purposes: (a) the refinancing of all or a portion of certain interim debt of Penn Highlands undertaken to pay all or a portion of (i) the costs of acquiring MVH, including refunding all or a portion of the following obligations (collectively, the "Prior Obligations"): the Washington County Hospital Authority Tax-Exempt Hospital Revenue Note, Series 2016A (Monongahela Valley Hospital, Inc.) (the "2016A Note"), the Washington County Hospital Authority Federally Taxable Hospital Revenue Note, Series 2016B (Monongahela Valley Hospital, Inc.) (the "2016B Note"), the Washington County Hospital Authority Tax-Exempt Hospital Revenue Note, Series 2018A (Monongahela Valley Hospital, Inc.) (the "2018A Note"), the Washington County Hospital Authority Tax-Exempt Hospital Revenue Note, Series 2018B (Monongahela Valley Hospital, Inc.) (the "2018B Note"), and the Washington County Hospital Authority Adjustable Rate Demand Hospital Revenue Bonds, Series 2018C (Monongahela Valley Hospital Project) (the "2018C Bonds") (ii) the costs of terminating one or more interest rate swaps entered into in connection with one or more of the Prior Obligations, and/or (iii) the costs of the construction, acquisition, renovation and/or installation of capital improvements and the furnishing and equipping of the same, including of (A) a healthcare center that will include, among other things, an outpatient clinic and related

improvements located in Ridgway, Pennsylvania, and (B) miscellaneous capital projects devoted to the exempt activities of Penn Highlands Healthcare and/or one or more of its affiliates (the forgoing

items (A) and (B) collectively, the "Capital Improvement Projects"); (b) costs of the Capital Improvement Projects, (c) the funding of any necessary reserves for the Bonds, if required; (d) the costs of credit enhancement, as necessary or desirable; and (e) the costs of issuance of the Bonds (collectively, items (a) through (e), the "Project").

WHEREAS, the Act provides that none of the powers granted thereby shall be exercised in the constructing, financing, improvement, maintenance, extension or operation of any project or projects which in whole or in part shall duplicate or compete with existing enterprises serving substantially the same purposes; provided however, that the foregoing limitations shall not apply to hospital projects or health centers to be leased to or financed with loans to public hospitals, non-profit corporation health centers or non-profit hospital corporations serving the public, if the municipality organizing the authority for such projects shall declare by resolution or ordinance that it is desirable for the health, safety and welfare of the people in the area served by such facilities to have such facilities provided by or financed through the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the facilities of the System serve the people of the City and serve or will serve areas in Clearfield County, Jefferson County, Clarion County, Elk County, Rush Township, Patton Township and Washington County; and

WHEREAS, the Authority approved the financing of the Project at a meeting duly held on August 27, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Authority conducted public hearings (each, a "TEFRA Hearing", and together, the "TEFRA Hearings") on behalf of itself, as the issuer of the Bonds, and on behalf of the City, as required by and in accordance with Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, a TEFRA Hearing was held in the City of DuBois, Pennsylvania at 11:00 a.m. on September 8, 2021 after due and proper advertisement thereof being duly given according to law, a copy of which has been provided to the Council of the City of DuBois (the "City Council") along with a transcript of such TEFRA Hearing.

WHEREAS, a TEFRA Hearing was held in the Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania at 2:30 p.m. on September 9, 2021 after due and proper advertisement thereof being duly given according to law, a copy of which has been provided to City Council along with a transcript of such TEFRA Hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE AND IT HEREBY IS,

RESOLVED, that it is desirable and beneficial for the health, safety and welfare of the people in the area served by the System, including the area served by the Project, to have the Authority issue the Bonds and to participate in the Project and it is desirable for the health, safety and welfare of the people in the area served by the System and served by the Project to have future projects undertaken by the Authority for the System and/or one or more of the affiliates of the System.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Authority is hereby authorized to undertake the Project and to issue the Bonds for such purpose.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the declaration made with respect to the Project extends to any additional bonds necessary to complete the Project, which may be issued by the Authority, provided,

however, that such declaration shall not be deemed to authorize changes increasing the scope of the Project.

RESOLVED FURTHER, the City Council hereby also approves the issuance of the Bonds proposed by the Authority pursuant to Section 147(f) of the Code.

RESOLVED FURTHER, the City Council hereby ratifies and approves the undertaking by the Authority of the TEFRA Hearings on behalf of itself as the issuer of the Bonds, and on behalf of the City. The City Council hereby acknowledges and confirms that a transcript of the TEFRA Hearings have been provided to it for the record.

RESOLVED FURTHER, the proper officers and representatives of the City are hereby authorized, directed and empowered on behalf of the City to execute any and all documents and to do or cause to be done any and all acts and things necessary or proper for the carrying out of the purposes of this Resolution, including, but not limited to, the approval of the Project and the issuance of the Bonds.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the approval of the Project shall not obligate the taxing authority of the City or its funds in any way.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that any resolution or part of any resolution conflicting with the provisions of this resolution is hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this resolution.
