ORDINANCE NO. 1668

AN ORDINANCE

AMENDING CHAPTER 10, PART I OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF DUBOIS TO REPEAL SECTION 103 AND TO ADD A NEW SECTION 103 AND A NEW SECTION 104 IMPOSING A MAXIMUM LENGTH OF TIME FOR THE STORAGE OF ABANDONED APPLIANCES ON PROPERTIES WITHIN THE CITY OF DUBOIS AND REITERATING THE FINE FOR VIOLATION OF PART I OF CHAPTER 10.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the City of DuBois, in Council assembled, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 10, Part I, Section 103 is hereby repealed in its entirety and the following is hereby enacted as Section 103:

Section 103. Maximum Length of Time of Storage of Abandoned Appliances. No abandoned, unattended or discarded iceboxes, refrigerators, freezers, washers, dryers, stoves or other appliances or containers may be stored or permitted to remain on, at or upon the exterior premises of any home or business located within the City of DuBois for more than thirty (30) days.

SECTION 2. Chapter 10, Part I is hereby amended by the addition of the following:


Section 104. Penalties. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine not less than fifty (\$50.00) dollars and not exceeding six hundred (\$600.00) dollars, together with costs and, in default of payment thereof, shall be subject to imprisonment for a term not to exceed thirty (30) days. Each day that a violation of this Part continues shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 3. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed. All other provisions of Chapter 10, Part I, not in conflict herewith are hereby re-ratified and re-affirmed.

SECTION 4. The within Ordinance shall be effective upon final enactment hereof.
