The City will replace a residential main water line in C.T. 3303, B.G. 1. Costs include the design, bidding, inspection, and construction of the waterline along portions of Orient Avenue, Division Street, North Court, and South Court.

2. General Administration: \$55,186.00

General administrative costs, including preparation of application, environmental review record, advertising, audit, planning, and management.

What do you plan to accomplish with this project?

The existing waterlines on portions of Orient Avenue, North Court and South Court need to be replaced. This is a loop water system. Approximately 3,500 feet of new 8" PVC waterline will be installed on portions of these streets (Orient Avenue between Division Street and the northern intersection of Green Glen Drive, Division Street between Orient Avenue and Benghouser Avenue, North Court from the intersection of Orient Avenue to the recently replaced waterline, and South Court from the intersection of Orient Avenue to the recently replaced waterline). In additon, the project will include all appurtenances including fire hydrants, gate valve assemblies, water service connections, etc. Restoration of the project area will include street paving, replacements of sidewalk/curbs, lawn restoration, etc.

How do you plan to accomplish it?

The City of DuBois will replace the old waterlines along portions of Orient Avenue, Division Street, North Court, and South Court with new 8 inch PVC lines. These streets are located in of C.T. 3303, B.G. 1, whose residents are 56.7% Low/Mod Income. This will provide adequate pressure for the residents and fire hydrants. There will be no tap-in fees since all of the residents on those streets are already connected to the main water lines.

How do you plan to use the funds?

THE RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DUBOIS APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF THE FY 2024 CDBG APPLICATION

A Resolution of the City Council of DuBois, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, authorizing the submission of an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development for funding through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program, as authorized under the Housing and Community Development Act [42 USC 5301 and 24 CFR Part 570], and further certifying compliance with the requirements of said program.

WHEREAS, it is necessary and in the public interest that the City of DuBois, Pennsylvania, receives funds from the Commonwealth through the Department of Community and Economic Development in accordance with the Community Development Block Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of DuBois has the legal authority and responsibility under PA Act 179 to apply for Community Development Block Grant funds; and

WHEREAS, the City of DuBois has undertaken a considerable citizen participation process including written invitations to municipalities, informational meetings, hearings and legal notices, all of which culminated in the prioritization of projects and development of a Community Development Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City of DuBois is familiar with the requirements of the program as provided for in the Housing and Community Development Act (HCDA) and the Community Development Block Grant regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of DuBois wishes to apply for said funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City of DuBois that its Mayor is authorized to have prepared necessary forms and documents to submit an application to the Department of Community and Economic Development for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for the purposes aforesaid; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if CDBG funds are determined by the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development to be expended on ineligible program costs or do not meet a national objective, the City Council of the City of DuBois agrees to repay that proportion deemed ineligible from non-federal sources; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Community Development Plan was developed in coordination with low- and moderate-income individuals, interested organizations, non-profits and other interested parties through the citizen participation process and municipal information gathering is hereby adopted; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor of the City of DuBois is empowered to place his signature, on behalf of the governing body, on the necessary application forms and affix thereto the official seal of the City of DuBois.

A. Three-Year Community Development Plan

City of DuBois, Pennsylvania Three Year Community Development Plan FY 2024 – FY 2025 – FY 2026

The City of DuBois is located in the northwestern section of Clearfield County. It is situated at the intersection of Interstate 80 and U.S. Route 219. The City serves as a transportation and commercial service center for a 35 mile radius. DuBois is an older, urban area with a diversified economic base. Even though the City has been directly impacted by similar trends that the national economy has faced, the City of DuBois is committed to revitalizing the economic base and rehabilitating distressed areas of the City that are in need of repair.

The City's population has continued to decline since the 1960s. According to the 2020 Census, the City had a population of 7,510. The CDBG funds and other public dollars will be invested in projects that will assist in maintaining and growing the population base. Improvements to the public infrastructure, housing, recreation facilities, and industrial areas will seek to enhance the physical aspects of the City. Emphasizing social and physical improvements will lead to the stimulation of residential, commercial, and industrial growth.

Incidence and Concentration of Low- and Moderate-Income Persons:

Although the ACS data reflects that the City of DuBois has 44.50% LMI, DCED gave approval for the City to conduct a city-wide survey to determine the percent LMI. The survey was conducted in 2016 and concluded that the City actually has a higher percentage of LMI than originally projected. The 2016 survey concluded that the City of DuBois has 52.57% LMI.

Community Development Needs

Housing

The City has an aged housing stock with many of the structures being constructed prior to 1940. According to 2020 census data, the City has 3,823 total housing units. Of the City's total housing units, 1,761, or 44.8%, were constructed prior to 1940. The presence of older, substandard, and vacant structures has created a safety hazard, as well as blighting influences on various residential neighborhoods and sections of downtown.

The US Census Bureau reported that there were 3,823 housing units as of April 1, 2020. ACS 2017-2021 data shows that the owner-occupied housing unit rate is 58.9% and the median value of owner-occupied housing units was \$97,100. It is estimated there are 399 vacant housing units. The City conducted a housing rehabilitation program with funding from CDBG, H&CD HOME, and FMHA which helped to upgrade older housing units, stabilize neighborhoods, and provide better public safety for low and low/moderate income persons.

The City has partnered with Central Pennsylvania Community Action and utilized a HOME grant to conduct a City-wide housing rehabilitation program.

Public/Community Facilities

A large number of the City's streets need to be improved. The City has been unable to provide the appropriate level of upkeep/maintenance and new construction due to the vastness of the problem. There are several miles of unpaved streets and alleys within the City limits.

The recreational facilities require continual maintenance and upgrades. City budgetary constraints make it difficult to properly maintain existing facilities as well as to construct new facilities. Several facilities have limitations for handicapped and elderly residents, which must be improved.

Fire is a constant threat in the City due to the age of both the housing and commercial building stock. As a result, firefighting equipment and facilities require continual maintenance and upgrades. In the previous three year period, the City dedicated portions of its CDBG funding to maintain and improve the fire stations. The most recent funds went toward the purchase of a rescue pumper.

The City needs to address its waterlines, especially in the oldest parts of the City which are predominantly areas with the highest concentration of low- and moderate-income persons. There are small diameter pipes which affect water pressure and hamper firefighting efforts at fire hydrants. The City has a loop water system that needs to be updated.

Public Services

Programs to meet the public service needs of the community have traditionally been met by nonprofit organizations. The City is using the services of the DuBois Food Pantry to meet the nutritional needs of unemployment and under employed families.

Economic Development

The unemployment rate in the City of DuBois has fallen below that of the State and Nation. According to the 2021 Five Year Estimates the City's unemployment rate is 4.2% compared to the State's 5.5% and the Nation's 5.5%. The unemployment rate has consistently fallen since the Covid-19 Pandemic when the City's unemployment reached 8.3%. The City has demonstrated a favorable recovery from the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Although the City boasts a historical industrial base, much of the economy is based in the commercial sector. A large number of national chain stores have opened in the area. The City's industrial base, as is common nationwide, has been struggling. The high-paying jobs have been replaced with minimum wage positions, resulting in individual buying power becoming diminished. The City will continue to market the area to industrial entities with the intent of returning the economy to its manufacturing roots.

The potential for growth and economic development in DuBois is aided by the City's access to Interstate 80 (East/West) and Route 219 (North/South). However, the quality of the local streets is an issue. Furthermore, at times, the existing traffic patterns can cause congestion. Lack of adequate parking in the downtown area is often an issue as well.

By continuing to enhance the City's infrastructure, DuBois will be more attractive and viable to future industrial and commercial developments.

Community Development Objectives

In the short term, the City plans to improve its water and sewer lines to address leakages, inadequate size of pipes, and lack of water pressure. As these projects are completed, the long-term goal of improving the quality of life of the citizens will be recognized, including improved firefighting.

Short-term Plan

The short-term (FFY 2023-2024) goals are to continue improving the main water lines in the City and improve the fire safety of its residents. FY 2021 and FY 2022 CDBG funds have been allocated for the replacement of main water lines in the center of the City in Census Tract 3303 Block Group 3. FY 2023 CDBG and FY 2024 CDBG funds will be used to improve waterline located in Census Tract 3303 Block Group 1. In the City's previous three years, the City allocated funding to park and recreation facilities.

Long-term Plan

The City's long-term (three year) plan is structured to implement a series of projects and activities that will address its stated goals. Where possible, the projects will package funds from additional state, federal, and local funding agencies. The City's long-term plan is three-fold. The City will identify and remove substandard, vacant, and abandoned structures through code enforcement. Second, the City will undertake street, sewer, and recreational improvements. Lastly, the City will remove architectural barriers along with depressed curbs/ramps for the benefit of handicapped individuals. Recreation projects and public facilities equipment have been identified as a priority. Additionally, the City will try to leverage funds in cases where private investments can be stimulated, offer incentives to private enterprises to provide employment and stabilize the tax base, and to further fair housing by continued cooperation with the Housing Authority and supporting fair housing practices within the City and work with other governmental agencies to maximize the use of local funds.

Sanitary Sewage

The City will continue to focus on upgrades to the City's sanitary sewer system. The current sanitary collection system is antiquated and is in need of repair and/or replacement. The City experiences inflow and infiltration issues during the wet season from pipes that are over 50 years old. If this situation was left to continue, the sewage treatment plant could be found to be non-compliant. The City has 290,000 lineal feat of sanitary collection pipe. The prudent course of action is to initially analyze areas where rehabilitation efforts can be efficient and feasible; continuing until the entire system has been upgraded.

Public Facilities and Services

Requests from eligible non-profit organizations will be considered as they are requested. The public facilities needs of the City will continue to be assessed and given high priority because of the lack of financial capabilities of the City to fund public services.

Recreational Facilities

The City has addressed several recreational projects recently. Additional recreational needs have been identified and the City plans on addressing these needs by supporting new projects. The community pool has been updated and walking paths and park equipment have been upgraded. In addition, Shower's Field, City Park and the Sandy Lick Creek recreation area have been funded for improved facilities. The City is committed to making all efforts to provide for the recreational needs of its residents. Previous years CDBG funds were allocated to Stern Field Reconstruction and Liberty Boulevard Recreational Area.

Street Improvements

Major curb replacements, resurfacing, and reconstructing streets are necessary in order to stabilize areas and help promote economic growth.

Removal of Architectural Barriers

There is an ongoing need for curb cuts, curb depressions, etc. which will be funded in future years along with Street Reconstruction work. ADA improvements are proposed with the City Pool project and the Senior Baseball Field project.

Housing Rehabilitation

The City will continue to address the housing needs of the community through providing assistance to homeowners to rehabilitate their homes. The City will apply for other grants and in cooperation with outside agencies will administer a citywide rehab program to income eligible homeowners.

Economic Development


The City has adopted and approved a Redevelopment Authority Plan that is designated to remove blight and carry out planning objectives for the City. An old brewery area has been targeted for redevelopment, which will help to create jobs overall. The downtown area is also a target area for redevelopment. The City's Main Street Program will assist in promoting the redevelopment of downtown.

Criteria

The short and long-term plans of the City of DuBois are structured to meet the criteria of aiding the low/moderate income population, preventing and eliminating slums/blight areas, and providing more and better public services. Additional, the City's short and long-term plans aim to promote economic development. The City's ultimate goal is to improve the quality of life for all residents, including the low/moderate income population.

The Community Development Plan was developed utilizing various resources and in consideration of local plans known at the time. The activities and objectives are the end result of discussion with City officials and meetings with public safety personnel, such as the Police Chief, Fire Chief, and ambulance groups. Groups such as the Chamber of Commerce, DuBois Area Economic Development Corporation, the Redevelopment Authority, and DuBois Renaissance have also provided input and insight into the plan.



The City of DuBois is an older built-up urban environment. The infrastructure is aging and the deterioration is occurring at a faster pace. This is especially true of the City's water system. There have been numerous breaks and leaks in the main water lines. Also some of the pipes are undersized which is creating a water pressure problem. These lines also leak and need to be replaced. The fire hydrants also lack adequate pressure to fight fires. The existing waterlines on portions of Orient Avenue, Division Street, North Court and South Court need to be replaced. This is a loop water system. Approximately 3,500 feet of new 8" PVC waterline will be installed on portions of these streets (Orient Avenue between Division Street and the northern intersection of Green Glen Drive, Division Street from the intersection of Orient Drive to the intersection of Bengouser Avenue, North Court from the intersection of Orient Avenue to the recently replaced waterline, and South Court from the intersection of Orient Avenue to the recently replaced waterline). In addition, the project will include all appurtenances including fire hydrants, gate valve assemblies, water service connections, etc. Restoration of the project area will include street paving, replacements of sidewalk/curbs, lawn restoration, etc.. The City of DuBois owns and operates the water supply system and service lines. It is a City department, not an authority or privately owned operation.
