Mayor Pat Reasinger called the meeting to order at 5:52 p.m. Reasinger turned the meeting over to Lisa Hagberg of the Interim Management team from Kafferlin Strategies.

PURPOSE OF THE PUBLIC HEARING

The purpose of the hearing is to discuss the advertised Council Bills No. 1985 – 2025 Budget, No. 1986 – 2025 Tax Levy, No. 1987 – 2025 Sewer Rates, and No. 1988 – 2025 Water Rates.

RESIDENT COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

<u>Anthony Suplizio – W. Weber Avenue</u>

"Is the \$2.00 increase per 1,000 gallons?" Hagberg confirmed.

Joel Keen – Home Camp Road

"So, am I correct? This is a 13.4% increase in sewage and 23.5% increase in water?" Hagberg did not have that calculation but noted it will generate an additional \$514,000.00 annually. Keen said residents were led to believe that with consolidation rates would decrease. "Seems like we're going the other way." Aughenbaugh added that a study is being conducted on what rates will look like after consolidation. Keen said, "It just seems like a lot of an increase to me. Waste Management was here a few weeks ago asking for 7% for dumpsters and was turned down."

Hagberg read the four Council Bills. After the reading of Council Bill No. 1976 – 2025 Tax Levy, Solicitor Associate Gieg noted typographical errors in Section 1 and Section 3 where the numbers in parenthesis did not match the words preceding them. Hagberg clarified, "It should be 10 mills in Section 1 and 1.75 mills in Section 3. These changes are due to Clearfield County changing the predetermined ratio." Corrections will be made and uploaded to the website.

ADDITIONAL RESIDENT COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

<u>Joel Keen – Home Camp Road</u>

Keen inquired, "Does the PUC need to be notified of a water rate increase?" Hagberg replied, "No."

<u>Joe Becker – E. Sheridan Avenue</u>

"Does the proposed budget include in the increases in the rates?" Hagberg replied, "Yes."

<u> Anthony Suplizio – W. Weber Avenue</u>

"What are we being charged for water now as compared to the new rates?" Hagberg did not have that information and will report back.

ADJOURNMENT
